Greetings and Happy New Year from Pastor Craig!

Today is the first day of 2021, so finally 2020 is in the rear view mirror. It's still bewildering to think back to this time last year, to the things that were happening in our lives, and to the hopes, dreams, and plans that were realistically on our radar, and then to recognize how quickly and completely all this changed.

It feels as though the rug was pulled out from under our feet since last March. Trips, family gatherings, the way businesses and organizations operate, community activities, work settings, health care, family and personal relationships; basically every aspect of our lives was suddenly altered, changed, or placed under threat.

Yet, we've also learned new things along the way, recognized our own strength and capacity to rise above a tough situation, and we've discovered again that we are part of families, a community, school, and church where we care for each other and want to make things better.

Item #1: Thank you for your enthusiastic participation in our Christmas Eve Facebook Live candlelight service. Our goal with each worship service

This Sunday, January 3rd, we will celebrate Holy Communion so if you are able plan to have bread and grape juice handy to join with us at that point in the service.

Item #3: We need a volunteer to shovel the church sidewalks in January. Mark Olson has been shoveling in November and December. Please call the church if you are able, again, leaving a message if necessary.

Item #4: I want to extend a heart-felt personal "Thank You" to each of you for your expressions of

Christmas cheer – your personal greetings and best wishes, and for your cards and gifts. Your support is always encouraging and is especially so this year, so please know of my deep gratitude.

I also want to thank Ely United Methodist Church for your Christmas card, with its sentiments of thanks for my leadership this past year and for the Amazon Gift Cards.

I cherish my personal relationships with each of you and the efforts and service you make on behalf of strengthening our church and making it be the strong "Little Church with a Big Heart" that we are. In this pandemic year I am keenly grateful for you even as I miss our being able to be together as we have in the past and will be again in the future.

58 GREAT THANKSGIVINGS

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING FOR NEW YEAR, EPIPHANY, BAPTISM OF THE LORD, OR COVENANT REAFFIRMATION

This text is used by the pastor while the congregation uses A Service of Word and Table II (UMH 13-15) or III (UMH 15-16) or one of the musical settings (UMH 17-25). Either or both of the bracketed [] sections may be omitted, depending on the occasion.

The pastor stands behind the Lord's table. See 28.

The Lord be with you. And also with you. Lift up your hearts. The pastor may lift hands and keep them raised. We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing,

always and everywhere to give thanks to you,

Father Almighty (almighty God), creator of heaven and earth.

Before the mountains were brought forth, or you had formed the earth, from everlasting to everlasting, you alone are God.

You created light out of darkness and brought forth life on the earth. You formed us in your image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away, and our love failed, your love remained steadfast. You delivered us from captivity, made covenant to be our sovereign God, and spoke to us through your prophets.

And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

The pastor may lower hands.

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The pastor may raise hands.

Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ, in whom you have revealed yourself, our light and our salvation.

[You sent a star to guide wise men to where the Christ was born; and in your signs and witnesses, in every age and through all the world, you have led your people from far places to his light.] to proclaim release to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed,

and to announce that the time had come

when you would save your people.]

By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your Church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

The pastor may hold hands, palms down, over the bread, or touch the bread, or lift the bread.

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread,

gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you.

Do this in remembrance of me."

The pastor may hold hands, palms down, over the cup, or touch the cup, or lift the cup.

When the supper was over he took the cup,

gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said:

"Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

The pastor may raise hands.

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving

as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

The pastor may hold hands, palms down, over the bread and cup.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here,

and on these gifts of bread and wine.

Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.

The pastor may raise hands.


By your Spirit make us one with Christ,

ANNUAL CHURCH CONFERENCE – MINUTES December 16, 2020 – Virtual meeting via Zoom

Call To Order: Pastor Craig Haberman called the meeting to order at 6:37 PM. **Attendees (13):** Lucy & Butch Diesslin, Craig Haberman, Linda Hane, Bev & Dan Johnson, Jim & Joan Nicholas, Margie & Mark Olson, Keith Rue and Jay & Jeanne Tomlinson.

Devotional: Pastor Craig had a brief meditation on Romans 8:22-25 read from *The Message* about how we are "enlarged" by waiting.

State of the Church: Pastor Craig referred us to the previously distributed 2020 Annual Church Conference handout containing a brief statement about the state of the church from his observations over the past year. He drew special attention to the section describing details of our response to COVID-19 and how it was heartening & encouraging for him. He is "grateful beyond words for the resilience, patience, maturity and good humor of our congregation as we have walked this difficult year together." **Budget 2021:** The proposed budget for 2021, totaling \$106,504.22, was presented by Finance Chair Bev Johnson and was briefly discussed. The budget is approximately

\$2500 less than the 2020 budget, some because of a reduction in our conference apportionments, and some because of reductions in other areas that were projected to be lower because of continued coronavirus restrictions. Linda Hane moved that we approve the proposed budget. Second by Jeanne Tomlinson. Motion passed.

Membership Report: Pastor Craig reviewed the Membership Report pointing out that he had made an error in listing our 3 confirmands under "Profession of Faith" instead of "Received from Preparatory Membership". He will correct that before sending the report to our conference. He pointed out that he had listed Andy Baker's death at the end of the report because he had not been a member but was a long-attending constituent. Lucy Diesslin moved that we accept the amended Membership Report. Second by Bev Johnson. Motion passed.

Leadership Nominations for 2021: Pastor Craig reported that he since a number of the Nominations Committee members weren't able to meet virtually, it was decided to notify all persons currently holding a position that their appointment would be extended for one year unless they would prefer to discontinue in that role. If so, they should notify Pastor Craig or the Ad Council of their decision and an appointment will be made later. This has been announced in the past two issues of the *Parish News*. Positions that are currently To Be Determined are: Lay Member to Annual Conference & Alternate, Finance Stewardship Chair and a third member of the Annual Audit Committee. It was pointed out that the Ad Council has the authority to approve any later appointments. Dan Johnson moved that we approve the nominations as presented. Second by Bev Johnson. Motion passed.

ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL – MINUTES

Wednesday, December 16, 2020 - Virtual meeting via Zoom

Call To Order: Chair Dan Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:15 PM. **Attendees (13):** Lucy & Butch Diesslin, Craig Haberman, Linda Hane, Bev & Dan Johnson, Jim & Joan Nicholas, Margie & Mark Olson, Keith Rue, Jay & Jeanne Tomlinson.

Opening: Pastor Craig expressed his gratitude for how this church has handled the pandemic. He then opened the meeting with a prayer.

Minutes: The November 18 & 20, 2020 Ad Council minutes as previously distributed to Ad Council members were approved. Motion to approve by Bev Johnson; second by Lucy Diesslin.

Treasurer's Report: Mark Olson had previously sent out a copy of the November 2020 Treasurer's report. He pointed out a few key items, particularly that our income for the month was almost twice what it was in October which was very nice to see. He commented that the amount that had been designated for Andy Baker's expenses would be transferred to the Memorial Fund per instructions by the donor. The account balances as of the end of November are General Fund \$35,116.73; Memorial Fund \$10,038.14; Building Fund \$4,373.41. Jeanne Tomlinson moved that we accept the Treasurer's Report as submitted, second by Lucy Diesslin. Motion passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

• **Trustees:** Margie Olson reported that no one has volunteered yet for Snow Removal for any of the months from January to April. Pastor Craig will do another plea in the *Parish News*.

• Worship: Linda Hane asked Pastor Craig to report the results of the December 7th Worship Committee meeting. The following had been discussed: • Poinsettias: An order for 10 had been place with Ely Flower & Seed.

‡ Worship Services: There have been tweaks each Sunday to improve computer camera placement and sound in our Facebook Live broadcast. The service has been started about 10 minutes early to allow Sheri Rue, serving as a hospitality host, to do greetings as people join in via Facebook. One of the tweaks to improve the sound was for those speaking to remove their masks when talking on camera and have a longer distance from any other persons whenever doing so.

‡ Advent Candles: We have been using members of the "broadcast production crew" so far but would like to have someone different lighting the candles this Sunday. It was agreed to have Margie & Mark Olson.

‡ Christmas Eve Service: One service will be held at 5:30 PM. Sue Germek has requested that a few of her family members be allowed to attend in the sanctuary. We discussed this, along with the idea of opening up the basement to up to 10 persons who don't have the ability to attend virtually. It was a consensus that this would be ok as long as those attending understand, and will comply with the restrictions of wearing a mask,

keeping properly social disance and not singing. Jeanne will call the people who were on the call list prior to the additional restrictions.

‡ December 27th Worship Service: Pastor Craig repeated the plan for having a link in the *Parish News* to the Conference pre-recorded worship service.

• **Outreach:** Jay Tomlinson reported that 2 apartment trees were put up: one on the first floor of the Pioneer Apartments and one in the usual place at Sibley. The Zenith Apartment community room was locked up for the pandemic and not available. He also reported that Bonnie Berglund, working with Linda Hane, had sent out about 25 thank you notes to our local "front-line workers".

• Visioning: Jay Tomlinson reported that the committee had met on December 10 to review the results of the "directory calls". Although the initial thought was to see if anyone had any needs that the church could help with, everyone contacted felt they had adequate support for their needs. And even though the callers weren't able to reach everyone, many of those they contacted expressed gratitude for the call, and we were able to get a number of address, phone and email updates.

• **Memorial Fund Task Force:** Margie Olson reported that \$200 had been given to Sue Germek to purchase special "singer masks" for the choir. The hope is to have the choir start up practice in the church sometime early next year once we are allowed to do so.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Status of JVC camera: Mauro from Custom Theater has our camera now and will be installing it shortly. Folks who need to understand how to use it should be at the church on Monday, December 21 at 2 PM. Dan recommended we do a "dry run" broadcast during that time while we have Mauro to help us if we have any issues.

NEW BUSINESS

1. **Payment to Jennifer Janekala for 2019 & 2020 garlands**: Linda Hane reported that the gal who supplies our garland for the front steps railings was paid \$70 this year for our 35 foot garland (\$2 per foot) but had not been paid for last year's, which would have been \$50 for a 25 foot one. She apparently does not send a bill so it was missed last year. Jay Tomlinson moved we pay her \$50, second by Linda Hane. Motion passed.

2. Choir Practice: Dan asked if we should discuss when the choir should be allowed in the church for practice since the current conference guidelines basically state no singing in the church until the pandemic is over. This topic was tabled until the January meeting.

3. All-Night Grad Party: Mark Olson reported that he's received the usual request for a donation for the All-Night Grad Party. Since we've already given our donation for 2020, this will be an item for the next meeting.

Items of Information

1. Next Ad Council meeting: Wednesday of January 20, 2021 at 7 PM.

2. Upper Room: Mark Olson reported as an FYI that the rate will be going up for our devotional booklets.
