Ely United Methodist Church Members/Friends,

Greetings from Pastor Craig! Well, I would say that, by any and all accounts, summer is finally here.

• "Meteorological Summer" arrived Tuesday morning when you turned your calendar from May to June.

• Today the temperature is forecast to rise to 91 degrees, with high temperatures in the 80's clear through a week from Saturday, June 12th.

• The Fourth of July celebration here in Ely, as we're used to it, is officially "back on the books!" The Farmer's Market has also resumed and Little League baseball is in full swing.

• Lawns, flower beds, and vegetable gardens are growing so quickly you can almost see their progress from one day to the next; if you keep enough water on them, that is!

It's wonderful to see so many people in town, even if it means keeping our head on a swivel when driving or walking to keep track of all the traffic.

There isn't a lot of brand-new information in *Parish News* today. The Prayer Wall (Item #4) is new. Items #1 and #2 have been updated since last week, but the request for church members to supply their birthdays (Item #3) is identical to last week's communication.

June is the busiest month of the summer for me with a mid-month, four-day canoe trip into Basswood Lake. A week later I'll travel down to the Twin Cities for my father's memorial service, immediately followed by the journey up to Crane Lake for a family reunion and our last time at the cabin my parents built in the late 1960's. My family will then return to Ely for some time together here. All of us (sons, daughters-in-law and grandchildren) will be in church on June 26th. The ten of us will be in town to experience an Ely Fourth of July, but I'll be on vacation. Dana Thompson will lead worship in my absence. Thank you, Pastor Dana, in advance. There will be no *Parish News* on June 18th and June 25th. There may be an abbreviated edition on July 2nd.

Item #1: Our Administrative Council held an unscheduled meeting on Wednesday of this week to consider the single agenda item: To consider changing our present mask and social distance policy for Sunday morning worship services. Here is the motion the Administrative Council passed.

Moved, seconded, and passed that "We follow the Minnesota governor's decision to remove 'all capacity and social distance requirements, as well as the indoor mask mandate.' This means wearing a mask during worship services for our church will be left up to the individual's discretion.

This means you no longer need to call Jeanne Tomlinson if you wish to attend worship on Sunday morning. Thank you, Jeanne, for coordinating this for so many weeks. And thanks again to each of you for your patience with all the adjustments you've had to make this year.

This Sunday, June 6th, the choir will sing for the first time since we closed down in March 2020.

Item #2: We will live-stream the service this Sunday from our new Facebook account: "Eumc MN," so please go there to tune in. We will also include directions to our new Facebook account on our previous Facebook page where you've been tuning in since we began live-streaming.

Three families who do not have personal Facebook accounts but were able previously to view our worship services via a link have reported not being able to do so now. We don't have any answer to this except you're not doing anything wrong. We don't know if you will be able to do so in the future or not, when our new Facebook account becomes more established. We're sorry you're no longer able to tune in. We'll provide an update if anything changes in this regard in the future.

Item #3: Eight families have responded to our Birthday Club by emailing us the birthdays and anniversaries of family members. Bravo! This is the last week we'll run this announcement.

We Need You! The Little Church with a Big Heart is starting a birthday club. The purpose of the club is to strengthen the bond that our church community already has, by recognizing individuals in writing on their birthdays. In order to do that, we need to know your birth dates (month and day only—year if you wish. The information will be stored in our Directory Roster spreadsheet. If you do not use e-mail, you can mail the information to the church at 305 East Camp Street, or you may drop it in the collection plate. Once our Birthday Club is running smoothly, we may expand it to recognize anniversaries, so if you are married, please include the date of your wedding, too—again, month and day, year if you wish.


