Here are a number of news items of various sorts.

Item #1: The CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) here in the United States has responded to recent surges of the Covid-19 Delta variant by issuing new masking guidelines. Governor Walz and Minnesota state agencies have also made announcements that include thirteen counties in Minnesota at last count. Our understanding of how severe this variant is or isn't and how to respond continues to evolve daily.

The CDC's messaging can be confusing as they seek to respond in real time and without the typical research cycle for peer review. Our Administrative Council will continue to carefully monitor nationwide, state, and local Covid-19 infection data and CDC guidelines as we have since March 2020. The Council's stance all along has been to remain as open as possible, while protecting the health of all our church members.

This Sunday is Communion Sunday. We'll offer a Covid-safe option for people worshipping in-person to come forward to the altar-railing for communion, while continuing to serve communion in the pews for those who desire to receive it there. If you are worshipping at home you may choose to have bread and grape juice available in order to have communion with us.

Item #2: Pathways to Wellness is an Ely community service that connects individuals and families in the Ely, Babbitt, and Tower area to resources to achieve their health and wellness goals.

Its referral services are free, person-centered, and confidential. Heidi Vanderbeek is one of a number of approachable people who staff this organization.
