Members and Friends of Ely United Methodist Church,

Greetings from Pastor Craig! Once again, we had gorgeous autumn weather this week, with temperatures dropping near freezing several nights. A number of you have had broad grins on your face recently when I've seen you, saying: "This is my favorite time of year."

Last Sunday evening through Tuesday noon I attended the Iron Range United Methodist Clergy retreat at Northern Pines church camp outside Park Rapids. The time was well-spent: worship, prayer, conversation, and reviewing how we and our respective congregations are weathering the pandemic. We also discussed hopes for the 2021-2022 school year.

Between Walker and Hill City on the way home I drove through the most brilliant fall color I have seen yet this year; it was breathtaking.

Item #1: Here is a brief update on our congregation's present response to Covid-19. Our church leaders continue to follow CDC and Minnesota Department of Health statistics regarding Covid-19 infections, hospitalizations, etc..... We also monitor the latest scientific findings about the dangers of the virus and vaccine effectiveness.

The wearing of masks at worship and other Ely UMC gatherings remains at the individual's discretion. We are passing the offering plates again, people are coming forward for communion, and children sit in a front pew during the children's time during. We are not having coffee fellowship time following the worship service however, nor do we have a time of moving about the sanctuary at the beginning of the service to greet one another.

Item #2: We began Sunday School last week and will continue during the worship service throughout the school year so we invite our families with children to join us on Sunday mornings at 10:00.

Confirmation students and their parents will have a meeting on Wednesday evening at 7:00 at the church.

Item #3: Please find attached the minutes from our most recent United Methodist Women and Administrative Council meetings. These minutes include additional details about our pasty making this year.

Item #4: Earlier this summer we announced new program of sending birthday cards to church members and their families. A number of you responded with you/your family's birthdays and we are now sending them out monthly. Here is the announcement we ran then with the invitation for those of you who are interested, but have not yet joined to contact us now.

The purpose of the club is to strengthen the bond that our church community already has, by recognizing individuals in writing on their birthdays. ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL – MINUTES

Wednesday, September 15, 2021 at Ely United Methodist Church

Call To Order: Chair Dan Johnson called the meeting to order at 7 PM.

Attendees (6): Lucy Diesslin, Craig Haberman, Dan Johnson, Margie & Mark Olson, Jeanne Tomlinson.

Opening: Pastor Craig briefly compared Psalm 23 from a Scottish Psalter with *The Message* and talked about the importance of balancing tradition with new ways of thinking. He then opened the meeting with a prayer.

Minutes: The May 19 and 26, 2021 Ad Council minutes, as previously distributed to Ad Council members and via *Parish News*, were approved. Motion to approve by Margie Olson; second by Lucy Diesslin.

Treasurer's Report: Mark Olson presented the May, June, July and August 2021 Treasurer's reports. The current account balances are: General Fund \$32,819.52; Memorial Fund \$10,073.53; Building Fund \$5,706.53. Jeanne Tomlinson moved that we accept the Treasurer's reports as submitted, second by Lucy Diesslin. Motion passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- Trustees: Margie Olson reported the following:
 - a) Dave Starkman sealed the parking lot blacktop and repainted the lines.
 - b) Margie Olson has been trying to contact Steve Anderson to put up some gutters at the back of the church.
 - c) BJ has done measurements but has not yet done the needed sewer work.
 - d) The bathroom switch at the parsonage has been repaired by Cunningham Electric.
 - e) A motion-sensor light is needed over the garage for the parsonage since the city has removed the nearby streetlight.
 - f) Mark Luthens repainted the handicap ramp.
 - g) The committee cleaned out the garage and Mark Luthens took all discarded items to the dump.
 - h) The basement door needs to be replaced. They'll be getting one for about \$500 from Menards and Larry Urbas will install it.
 - i) Gary Felder and Ger Niskala have been mowing the lawn; Dan Johnson and Liddy Sheppard have been taking care of the other landscaping needs.
 - j) The next Trustees meeting will be on October 6 at 7 PM.
- **Pastor-Parish Relations:** Jeanne Tomlinson reported that the committee will also meet on Wednesday, October 6 at 7 PM. Since there is no overlap in committee members this should not be a conflict with the Trustees.

- Worship: Linda Hane reported that the liturgist signup and piano/organ player arrangements have been going well.
- UMW: Lucy Diesslin reported that the UMW discussed plans to start up making pasties again, starting with November and just doing it two other months (February and April). More plan details will be in the UMW meeting minutes which will be distributed with the *Parish News*.

OLD BUSINESS

- 1. **Ad Hoc technology commmitee**: The committee has been formed with Pastor Craig, Dan Ely, and Sheri Rue to develop a job description and also to look for a couple more members.
- 2. Tweaking of indoor service relative to evolving Covid-19 concerns: Evaluation continues each week as we watch the local case numbers. We have started up in-person Sunday School for the kids and will start passing the offering plates this coming Sunday (Sept 19). After-worship fellowship/refreshments and the in-worship meet & greet is still a ways off.
- 3. **Outdoor/Memorial Service:** This ended up not happening because so many people prefer the in-person indoor worship to the "in-car/scattered lawn-chair" service. The Memorial Committee will need to set a date for the Memorial service. Pastor Craig suggested All-Saints Day (Nov 7) as a possible date.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1. **Prep for Church Conference, "first look"**: Pastor Craig reported that we'll continue with our normal schedule for our All Church Conference so it will be on December 15. The Nominating Committee will be meeting to work on nominations. He has received the various required forms from conference for our annual Church Evaluation and Pastor salaries and copies have been sent to the PPRC chair.
- 2. **Parish News** vs **The Fish:** We discussed possibly restarting **The Fish** and only using **Parish News** for information that is needed in a more timely manner. We'll then distribute it electronically to our current email mailing list and send a paper copy to all the others we have in our newsletter label list. The first **Fish** issue would include a request for people receiving the paper copy to contact us with an email address, if willing, in order to save funds on stamps & printing. We briefly discussed changing **The Fish** format to one that most organizations use that allows the printed electronic copy to match the mailed paper copy, eliminating the need for two versions. This subject needs to be discussed with Jay Tomlinson, the current newsletter and web site coordinator, before we proceed with any changes to the current process.
- 3. **Confirmation:** Pastor Craig reported that he currently has two scheduled confirmands, Drew Johnson and Wyatt Tedrick, and may have a few more.

UMW Ad Hoc Meeting at Ely United Methodist Church September 8, 2021 11 AM-12:10 PM

Note: This meeting was called to primarily discuss the status of Pasties.

Attendees: President Lucy Diesslin, Vice-President Bev Johnson, Secretary Jeanne Tomlinson and UMW members Margie Olson and Linda Hane, and Pastor Craig Haberman.

President Lucy Diesslin opened the meeting at 11 AM to begin our discussion of when, and if, we should resume making pasties as well as other logistics. We discussed possibly discontinuing it entirely since we aren't currently having a great financial need for it, but there was concern that if we go too long without doing them, and a financial need arises, it might be much harder to get a lot of our customer base back. It was also mentioned that even though our General Fund balance is healthy, our Building Fund is inadequate for many needed maintenance/improvement projects. "Pasty Fellowship" was also mentioned as an important aspect since working together to make pasties has always been wonderful for getting to know others better as well as drawing in people who don't even attend our church. We agreed that if we resume, we should raise the price to \$7 each and that folks will need to be called prior to the pasty month to commit to orders so that we can order the right amount of product and then called again the week prior as a reminder. We also would want to limit the total to no more than 600 pasties and allow no more than 8 pasties per any one customer order.

It was also thought that just 3 times a year instead of 6 might be the way to go since we don't have an immediate financial need. We talked about when we should start up and thought we could try for this coming November after we've had a chance to see if we get any local surge of COVID cases with the kids going back to school. Jeanne Tomlinson moved that we plan on doing pasties in November, February, and April. Second by Margie Olson. Motion passed. There was concern expressed about getting enough younger workers to help out. It was decided we'll need to call workers up to see about a commitment. We know there will be strong resistance if we require all workers to wear a mask and gloves at all times and it might greatly limit our worker pool if we require it rather than make it optional. Jeanne will contact any previous workers to see about their availability for working in November and their feelings about possible mask/glove requirements.

We then discussed resuming our monthly UMW meetings. We decided to change from the 4th Wednesday of each month at 1 PM to the 3rd Wednesday of every month at 10 AM and will start back up on Wednesday, October 20. If we can determine which devotional book we were reading, and if there are still sections left to read, we'll continue with that book and we will just have coffee and tea available without having an official hostess preparing goodies and fancy table set-up.
