Members and Friends of Ely United Methodist Church,

Greetings from Pastor Craig! The unseasonably warm autumn weather continues. I just looked it up – our average high for October 8th is 55 degrees and the low is 32 degrees. It's been warm with lots of sun, but now soggy weather moves in, which is a good thing, but also means to keep the raincoat handy.

I'll be attending a funeral tomorrow (Saturday) in Fargo. Duane Heideman, a 64-year-old friend of mine, died in a single vehicle accident on Monday. That makes three funerals in a month after only attending two in three years, both being my parents.

The United Methodist graveside service begins with the words: "In the midst of life we are in death; from whom can we seek help?" The answer is in the next sentence: "Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth."

Life is indeed a miracle. Merely the fact that you and I are here on this astonishing planet as living, breathing, thinking beings capable of movement, communication, learning, artistic expression, and the giving and receiving of love should cause awe to swell up within us each and every day.

Yet, our world sags also under the weight of disheartening individual and social problems; of disease, hunger, war, oppression, addiction, poverty, and environmental degradation. In the face of this, we humans strive to bring healing to that which is broken and we trust that God is at work as well.

Centuries ago, the Apostle Paul said: "If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's." (Romans 14:8) This seems to me to be a pretty good philosophy of life in good times and in bad.

As I drive to Fargo and back home again, I'll be thinking of the way that Duane touched my life – his laugh, his powerful singing voice, his faith in Christ, his exuberance, his vast technical knowledge, his willingness to help – as well as personal struggles that often hamstringed him and caused his spirits to sag. I'll be noticing the variety of beautiful scenery as I begin my travels on Canadian Shield here in Ely and end in the Red River Valley in Fargo, traveling through all kinds of terrain in between. I'll be reflecting on the strengths and struggles of the Minnesota towns I drive through.

Life is a miracle. It's a journey. It's a mystery. And a whole lot else. I'm grateful to be living in Ely and to be sharing all of this with you.
