Members and Friends of Ely United Methodist Church,

Greetings from Pastor Craig!

Several times each day I spend a long moment day gazing out the large, north-facing window in my kitchen. It overlooks a twenty-foot swatch of lawn that includes a ten-foot mountain ash tree. The woods, which start on the north side of the lawn fall steeply down a hill that is in a bowl bounded on the east and west by 3rd Avenue East and Central Avenue, and Beacon Hill and the homes off Boundary Street on the south and north.

All year round there's always something to see on a small patch of the natural world, even this summer during the extreme drought, when flickers poked and foraged through the parched and brown lawn for insects.

Then, just in time plentiful rains came so that the yellow leaves, which are falling now from the birch and poplar trees land on brilliant green grass.

It's a beautiful sight to behold, almost like a quilt, the way the leaves spread and space themselves out in a pattern on the ground. When they first started to fall, few in number, they seemed to land equidistant from each other. How interesting! The same has happened ever since as the number of leaves on the carpet of green has slowly grown. It's as if by some unspoken agreement they independently choose their respective final destinations like an artist painting an autumn landscape.

Now I'm sure scientists can account for this distribution by means of some mathematical formula or probability theory. Such efforts are important in helping to understand our natural world. However, this autumn, it's only poetry and wonder that are in my heart and on my mind as I look out my window. This is so incredibly beautiful. Thanks be to God for this planet on which we stand!

Or as the Psalmist reminds us these two verses from Psalm 104, a Psalm that rejoices in God as our Creator and Provider

²⁴ O LORD, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

This week one of the Scripture readings on Sunday morning will be the last chapter of the book of Job in the Old Testament. We've read from the book of Job the last two Sundays without much comment, but on Sunday the sermon will look at these timeless words.

I've listed the first six verses here. They are Job's answer to God after God reminds Job of our human inability to comprehend the vastness of the universe and of our place in it. We'll also read on Sunday the final ten verses that tie up loose ends to the story with what happens to Job's three friends and Job himself.

There are no easy or pat answers here to suffering or to other puzzles in life. There is, however wisdom for how to live amidst ambiguity and adversity in a world, which we believe is charged with the grandeur of God who is steadfast in His love for us.
