Members and Friends of Ely United Methodist Church,

Greetings from Pastor Craig!

Deer season is upon us once again! I went partridge hunting in high school and with my younger son when he was in high school, but have never gone deer hunting. Nevertheless, I have so many memories of deer season all across Minnesota.

- I recall when we lived in Cook fifty-plus years ago how there were wall tents with wood stoves up and down back country roads between Orr and Kabetogama. If memory serves, this was before hunters wore blaze orange, but were festooned in deep red garb.
- Once in the late 1980's, I was out running on my favorite five-mile route outside Verndale during deer season and suddenly being filled with panic thinking: "What am I doing out here?!"
- I was a regular customer at Fleet Farm between April 2016 and July 2018 when I lived in Alexandria. Several nights before deer season opened, I dropped in to pick up a few things, having not been there for a week or so. One corner of the store was so filled with blaze orange clothing of all types it almost hurt my eyes. The atmosphere that evening was festival-like as hunters and non-hunters alike moved through the store in high anticipation of the next several weeks.

It's all my way of saying this is a fun time of year for Minnesotans, an unofficial end of fall and a bridge between Halloween and Thanksgiving. I hope you have a productive, memorable, and safe hunt – a time to catch up on old memories and make some new ones.

Item #1: November 7, one from this Sunday, the worship service will be one of memory, thanksgiving, and celebration. The Sunday is known as All Saints' Day on the Christian calendar. We will:

- Recognize memorial gifts received and who they were given in memory of between July 2019 and the present, with the ringing of our church bell.
- Read a list of people who have been members of Ely United Methodist Church for 60 plus years, 50 plus years, and 40 plus years.
- Offer people attending worship in-person or online an opportunity to write the name(s) of loved ones who have died since July 2019 on slips of paper provided. Ushers will bring these names forward to be read as part of the Great Thanksgiving in our Communion Service.
- We'll take Holy Communion together.

Please join us online or in-person for this joyous Sunday if you're able. We invite those of you worshipping at home to have bread and grape juice handy to take communion with us.

Those who worship online can forward the names of loved ones you would like read during the Great Thanksgiving in one of two ways — either in the comments section of the Facebook Live broadcast as the service begins or to our church Gmail account at elymn@gmail.com. We encourage you to add your relationship to the person or persons you list.

Those of you on a deer stand in the pre-dawn darkness can be a part of our gathering by remembering and giving thanks for those who have gone before and what they meant to you and your families.

Item #2: We'll resume making pasties on Monday and Tuesday, November 15th and 16th for the first time since we shut down for the pandemic. Please talk to Jay or Jeanne Tomlinson if you're able to help. There are a wide variety of tasks – peeling eyes off machine-peeled potatoes, rutabaga peeling, weighing dough balls, rolling out pasty dough, mixing ingredients together, and crimping. We prefer workers be vaccinated due to the length of time we'll be together and our proximity to each other.

Item #3: Advent and Christmas are still a ways off, but we are making plans now for activities that will be upon us even before Thanksgiving.

You can purchase poinsettias in memory of loved ones. These will be part of our Christmas Eve service and probably Sunday, December 19th as well. You may take them with you following the Christmas Eve service if you wish. The cost for poinsettias is \$14.00 and the deadline to sign up is November 23rd. There will be a sign-up sheet at the rear of the sanctuary beginning this Sunday and an envelope for cash or check. Or you may mail the church at 305 E. Camp Street, Ely, MN 55731. Please mention who or whom you want the poinsettia to be in memory of.

We will be decorating the church for Christmas on Sunday, November 21st immediately following worship. There will be sign-up sheets in the rear of the church for people to indicate you're able to help and which area of the church you would like to assist decorate.

We're also going to be participating in the Ely Community Resource Giving Tree this year, which provides Christmas gifts to youth and children in the Ely community. There will be fifteen tags on the small Christmas tree in the rear of the sanctuary, each one signifying the gift and age of the recipient.

Item #4: Here is a UMW update from the minutes published last week. Our Christmas Luncheon at the GEL had to be changed to Monday Dec 13 since the original date listed in the minutes couldn't be accommodated. Sign up sheet will be at the church or call Jeanne (218/235-8479).
