Greetings from Pastor Craig!

We've had over a foot of snow in Ely since the last edition of *Parish News* and the temperature as dropped below zero as well. Southwestern Minnesota could receive a foot of snow in a winter storm soon to sweep through that area. The snow there, unlike here will blow and drift in a manner that might close roads.

It looks like a White Christmas for us, even though the snow might melt off by Christmas for our neighbors to the south.

This season is one of hope, anticipation, and joy as we await our Savior's birth. God has been faithful across many centuries and will continue to pour out His generous love upon all Creation.

Yet the upheavals and uncertainties of life don't stop even during joyous times like Advent or Christmas. Or any other festival season within the church or without. Sin and suffering, pain and death remain part of life 365 days a year.

Tootsie Loe, our friend and fellow church member, died Wednesday evening at Ely hospital. She had been nearly a life-long Elyite and member of our church for over sixty years.

Since summer Tootsie knew her time was limited and was under hospice care at the time of her death, but lived life to the full even as her health declined. She crimped pasties on November 16th, joined in putting up Christmas decorations November 21st (chili lunch to follow), and was in church on Sunday, November 28th. Tootsie lived a long and lively life, filled with faith, family, and friends.

Tootsie's funeral service will at the church on Friday, December 17, at 11:00, with visitation beginning at 9:30. Visitation will also be at Kerntz Funeral Home from 4:00 to 7:00, Thursday, December 16.

Item #1: For those of you attending the UMW Christmas Luncheon this coming Monday, December 13, 2021, at 12 Noon, we'll have a large basket at the luncheon for donations of the following items needed by the shelters in Virginia and our local food shelf: paper products (paper towels, toilet paper, tissues) and women's sanitary products. If you can, please bring an item to add to the basket. Linda Hane will be delivering those to the shelters and food shelf.

Item #2: Our Christmas Eve Candlelight Service will be at 5:30 Christmas Eve. This will be our traditional service of hymns and scripture readings. The choir will sing. We'll end the service by lighting candles, singing Silent Night in a darkened sanctuary, and then Joy to the World with the lights back on.

Item #3: Our Annual Church Conference is scheduled for Wednesday, December 15 at 7:00 p.m. The Annual Church Conference functions as the annual meeting in United Methodist churches. The meeting is typically very short and consists of

receiving a report from Finance Committee (the 2022 church budget which includes Pastor Craig's compensation), a Membership Report, and short report from Pastor Craig. The Nominating Committee will present their report for possible amendment and approval. All Ely UMC members are invited to attend.

Item #4: Our church has reluctantly gone back to a "people should wear masks" policy, and only after careful consideration. The world-wide and local situation with the virus is shifting so rapidly that no-one is really quite sure where we're at presently, where we're headed, and what it all means.

As our Administrative Council deliberated Saturday (November 27th) during a specially-called Zoom meeting we felt it was essential to develop a policy that could be adjusted as we go. Our criteria are and will be recommendations, first from the CDC (Center for Disease Controls and Prevention) and then our Governor's office.

I know this is deeply disappointing to many of you. It is to us as well; it feels like a step back and a wet blanket on the joy we've felt during our recent worship services. Our goal always is for services to be as worshipful and life-forming as possible, whether via Facebook Live or in-person with as few restrictions as we feel are safely possible.

We have the same high quality, disposable masks available you see at some establishments around town in case you arrive at church without one.

As always, we'll keep you updated as often as is necessary.

In the bleak midwinter, frosty wind made moan, Earth stood hard as iron, water like a stone; Snow had fallen, snow on snow, snow on snow, In the bleak midwinter, long ago. Our God, Heaven cannot hold Him, nor earth sustain; Heaven and earth shall flee away when He comes to reign. In the bleak midwinter a stable place sufficed The Lord God Almighty, Jesus Christ.

Angels and archangels may have gathered there, Cherubim and seraphim thronged the air; But His mother only, in her maiden bliss, Worshipped the beloved with a kiss.

What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part; Yet what I can I give Him: give my heart.
