A Note from Pastor Craig

Caution While Parking in our Upper Parking Lot

An Open Communion Table at Ely United Methodist Church

Earlier this week we had a day of bright sunshine and temperatures around 30 degrees. City streets exposed to the bright rays of the sun rapidly began to soften up and melt. A few had spots that were completely bare by mid afternoon. This is what can happen when the sun moves higher in the sky this time of year.

There may be a large snowstorm moving through our area and to the south Saturday afternoon into Sunday morning; something that also happens this time of year. We have numerous memories of blizzards during the state hockey and basketball tournaments. I also recall one year around 2005 when Bemidji received 41 inches of snow - in April.

Yet the length of daylight steadily increases, the sun climbs ever higher in the sky, and the snow will melt, sooner or later, all of it. Winter will not extend indefinitely.

We had an enormous amount of snow one year in the 1990s when my family lived in Orr. Some time in mid-March I thought "they'll be able to snowmobile until well into April this year." Yet only a week or two later I noticed a portion of a snowmobile trail had melted all the way down to gravel where it climbed an embankment to cross the highway in Buyck. The power of the sun was just too much.

Sometimes it's an early winter and a late spring; or a short summer and an extended autumn; La Niña or El Niño; and so on... But the seasons will come and go; at least here in northern Minnesota.

The same with seasons in the church year - Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, and Ordinary Time. Not all congregations commemorate the church year, but Ely United Methodist Church does. Their variety and our movement through them brings a deeper understanding of who God is, what Jesus' mission was, and the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

The Church Season of Lent

Two realities intersect during Lent: First, Jesus was crucified, something he chose willingly to do, something he said "was in accordance with the Scriptures." Second, the promise of self-improvement and inevitable progress is built into our DNA here in the United States.

We see in Jesus' crucifixion that the powers of evil, sin, and death cannot be overcome by willpower, intelligence, and effort alone. Something else is necessary and that something is the grace of God in the self-giving love of Jesus Christ. Or as the Apostle Paul said: "We proclaim Christ crucified.... God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength."

This is not to diminish the value of human strength, vision, or persistence. Our hearts swell with admiration when watching movies or hearing examples of people overcoming impossible odds to achieve their dreams in athletics, art, social change, or surviving all kinds of catastrophes. Anything worth doing is worth doing well.

But when it comes to our life with God often "the path up is down," as someone has said. Surrender and acceptance draw us nearer to God and one another than do striving and pushing harder.

This is the journey of Lent in the Scripture readings we'll hear each week, in our Holy Week service Thursday evening April 14th, and in our joyous Easter morning worship, Sunday April 17th when we proclaim: "Christ is Risen, the Lord is Risen Indeed."

Scripture Readings and Worship Notes for Sunday

Here's a brief review of how we've arrived at the church season of Lent: During <u>Advent</u> (the four Sundays before Christmas) we wait and watch for the coming of Christ, as did God's faithful people in the centuries before Jesus' birth. We rejoice when <u>Christmas</u> finally arrives and Jesus is born in a stable. Then comes the season of <u>Epiphany</u>, when we take a closer look at the person of Jesus himself. We've waited for Jesus so long - just who is the one we were we waiting for and what will be the purpose of his life?

Our focus shifts when the church season of <u>Lent</u> arrives. Now we recognize that Jesus' coming includes his bowing before the powers of sin and death. Jesus offers his life, trusting that he is secure in God's love for him, and that his Heavenly Father will raise him up on the third day.

Further, during Lent we see in the Scripture readings that Jesus' life is a continuation of God's action in the history of Israel recorded in what we call the Old Testament. His life is another chapter to the same, ongoing account of God's love reaching out to all of Creation, which includes you and me.

The Gospel reading this week is the account of Jesus being tempted by the devil. We'll also celebrate Holy Communion and the choir will sing.
