Spring has not yet come, this year, anyhow, but God comes. God routinely shows up. It's coming we can count on; God coming on God's own initiative.

Abram and Sarai weren't looking for anything more than a new homeland when God came to them with the additional promise: "I will make of you a great nation."

The shepherd boy David wasn't looking to be king when God chose him ahead of his seven brothers to be the king of the twelve tribes of Israel.

A teenaged woman named Mary wasn't looking to be the mother of Jesus, the Messiah, when God said: "Greetings, favored one! You will conceive in your womb and bear a son."

God comes to us to further God's purpose - our salvation and the salvation of the world. It's not something we have to figure out, or discover, rather it's something we join in on. We say "yes" to God who has already found us in Christ.

That rather than asking the popular question: "What do I want to do with my life" we ask "Which God am I worshipping and how is that God having his way with me?" In other words, it's impossible for us to choose our way into a good life,

but it is possible to discern the good life God has chosen for us.

National Day of Prayer

The National Day of Prayer has been observed in the United States since 1962 when it was signed into law by the United States Congress. This tradition of prayer goes all the way back to John Adams, our second president, who established days of fasting and prayer back in 1798.

The National Day of Prayer organization nationwide has established five categories for citizens to pray for: Family, Church, Business, Education, Military, Government, and Arts/Entertainment, and Media.

A National Day of Prayer committee here in Ely, including Patty Rusco from our congregation, is organizing a gathering at the Ely Senior Center on Thursday, May 5th from 12:00 pm to 1:00 pm. (The Ely Senior Center is at 27 S. 1st Avenue West.) The committee encourages you to make a commitment to attend and to invite one or two others to make the same commitment.

New Floor in the Basement and Fundraiser

Our Administrative Council has approved a project to replace the floor in all of the church basement except the nursery area. The new floor, which is vinyl "planking," will float over the existing floor. We are purchasing it from Floor to Ceiling in Virginia and hope to be on their installation schedule for early summer.

The cost of material and installation is right around \$25,000. We have some funds on hand and will do a fundraiser for the remaining \$15,000. Make out checks for any donations to "Ely United Methodist Church" with "Building Fund" in the memo line. Watch for a thermometer in the rear of the sanctuary to measure our progress.

Short Survey from Northwoods Partners

Nearly all of you are aware of Northwoods Partners and a number of you have served on their board. Northwoods Partners is a non-profit organization in Ely with the following mission: "The mission of Northwoods Partners is to provide resources that promote independence and healthy aging."

They have recently received a substantial grant from the Northland Foundation to facilitate coordination between community agencies here in the Ely area. And to make this information more accessible to area residents.

A short survey that can be completed in a few minutes is an important part of this effort. Surveys will be available in the rear of the church beginning Sunday, April 24. The surveys are designed for people over 50 years of age and should be returned before the middle of May. Scripture Readings for Sunday

For those who follow Jesus Easter isn't only a single day, it's a church season, fifty days and seven Sundays in length. Someone has written: "During the season of Easter, we are invited to reflect on the impact of Jesus' death and resurrection. We're also able to get a renewed sense of how Easter relates to the church's mission, impelling the church to faithful witness as it moves out into the world. (Preaching through the Christian Year, Year C. p. 232.)

The worship service on Sunday will open with a Call to Worship from Psalm 150 where we hear the celebratory instruction: "Let everything that breathes, praise the Lord." https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Psalm+150&version=NRSV

The Epistle Reading comes from the first chapter of the Revelation of John. In these five short verses John communicates a "feeling of triumph and confident hope" to a church that is experiencing oppression and uncertainty. (Ibid. p. 235.)

The Gospel Reading from John is the memorable account of Jesus' appearing to his disciples the first Easter night. Thomas is not with them. When they report to Thomas that they have seen the Lord, Thomas replies: "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."
