A Note from Pastor Craig

Annual Conference Meeting - 2022

The Minnesota Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church is being held in-person in St. Cloud on Tuesday and Wednesday, May 24 and 25.

Jay Tomlinson is our lay delegate and will be attending. Prominent legislative items will deal with our Annual Conference's commitment to inclusiveness in all aspects of church life. Also with figuring out an amicable pathway for churches who have fundamental disagreements with these new developments to leave the denomination.

I (Pastor Craig) am unable to attend, but will attend the virtual clergy session that is scheduled for Thursday, May 19th. I've also visited with Jay concerning the legislative items he will be voting on. I was awakened while it was still dark on Thursday morning this week by rain softly falling on the roof of the parsonage. Violent storms had moved through the Twin Cities the night before, but this was the kind of gentle rain that sounds like a lullaby.

The effect the rain had on me brought to mind some words written by John Muir 150 years ago where he said.

"I used to envy the father of our race, dwelling as he did in contact with the new-made fields and plants of Eden: but I do so no more, because I have discovered that I also live in 'creation's dawn.' The morning stars still sing together, and the world, not yet half made, becomes more beautiful every day." "Climb the mountains and get their good tidings. Nature's peace will flow into you as sunshine flows into trees. The winds will blow their own freshness into you, and the storms their energy, while cares will drop off like autumn leaves." (The Wilderness World of John Muir. Edited by Edwin Way Teale. p. 311.)

I think we all recognize how fortunate we are to live in Ely surrounded by so much natural beauty - lakes, streams, trees, rocks, wildlife, and the beauty of the heavens. We do experience God and in some ways God is made known to us through <u>Creation</u>. And for this I am grateful.

There is necessarily more, however, to knowing God. God is also made known to us through Jesus Christ as he is revealed in Scripture through gift of the Holy Spirit. Christ is a primary touchstone with God.


