

Basement Floor Fundraising Update

\$12,130

The good news is our fundraising is going well. We've now raised \$12,130 toward our goal of \$15,000. This is in addition to an existing \$10,000 seed money from Tootsie Loe's memorial and another individual contribution.

The bad news is that we've discovered water damage in the kitchen, which makes necessary removing the old floor that contains asbestos. Previously we thought we wouldn't have to remove the old tile floor because it would be covered by the new floor. Our Board of Trustees has voted to have the asbestos removed throughout the basement at an additional \$7,130 cost. There are also some ceiling tiles that will need to be replaced.

All work is scheduled for the month of June.
