Trustee Projects Update

Our Board of Trustees continues to work on a number of projects with our church building and the parsonage were Pastor Craig lives.

We removed the lower branches from half a dozen trees at the parsonage and carried them away.

The basement floor project has hit yet another bump in the road. The concrete slab under the tile is so uneven that the new flooring won't sit flat, so the installers had to spread a "slurry" undercoating first. This will add extra cost. Floor to Ceiling has been great to work with the pricing on this.

The wheelchair ramp on the west side of the building and rear steps on the east side have been stained.

We are planning on resurfacing the front steps this summer, but are waiting on material and labor.

A Note from Pastor Craig

Greetings on this Fourth of July weekend! What a wonderful event, both for the celebrations in Ely and for the opportunity to think back on our nation's origins and to reflect upon our identity as a people.

Our origins begin with words that ever since they were first penned have defined what we have stood for at our best: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." https://www.archives.gov/founding-docs/declaration-transcript. (Note: the language comes from the 18th century.)

There is no question we haven't always been at our best. By one count 41 of the 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence owned slaves. Women weren't given the vote until the 19th Amendment was ratified on August 18, 1920, only 102 years ago.

But the Declaration of Independence is a vision of who <u>we aspire to be</u> and what the structure of our Constitution gives us the opportunity to be. These words inspire me and are capable of inspiring us as a people to move incrementally toward this vision.

One frustration among others that seems to be ever increasing in volume nowadays is that we're a divided nation. I read a column this week with the title "America is Growing Apart, Possibly for Good." The "P" word today when referring to our country isn't "Promise" or "Potential," but "Polarization."

Our beloved nation has always included people who hold very different perceptions of what's going on and the best way to solve our problems. One commentator I trust suggests that what makes today different is that there is a growing trend to view people who disagree with us as less than human, as people not possessing dignity.

How else do we overcome this than by getting to know people who are different than us, by growing to respect people who believe very different things than we do?

I read a fascinating book last year - "American Harvest: God, Country, and Farming in the Heartland" written by Marie Mutsuki Mockett. She is multi-ethnic and has lived most of her life on either the East or West Coast, but her family owns a farm in Nebraska.

In the book she spends a season with a custom combining crew traveling from Texas to Idaho. She is immersed 24/7 in a sea of differing beliefs and lifestyles and comes to know a wide variety of people over an extended period of time. This is a transforming experience for her. Perhaps one reason we're polarized is we've retreated into interacting only with people who are just like us.
