### A Note from Pastor Craig

Greetings and a very Happy New Year! Christmas is a joyful time; in church, in our homes, and in the Ely community. For some people, our anticipation begins building in mid-November (or before!), but most of us don't catch the Christmas fever until Thanksgiving has come and gone.

As our anticipation peaks there is Christmas music and lights everywhere. Our homes are filled with scurrying about making final preparations. Then all of a sudden Christmas Eve has come and gone. We regroup the week between Christmas and New Year's Day. Then it's time to tuck everything away, straighten up the house, and get back to our routines, because it's those routines that will carry us though the rest of the year, isn't it?

But there's no pause in church, no long winter's nap in worship, education, fellowship, or prayer. There is only a shift in focus, for now we are in the church season of Epiphany, which is an awe-inspiring time. This is when who Jesus, born in a manger, is revealed to be. We see his ministry begin. The Good News, which so far only the shepherds and wise men have been let-in-on is now shared with all the world, beginning with the Jewish people.

The English word "epiphany" is translated from the Greek word *epitaphaneia*, which means <u>manifestation</u> or <u>appearance</u>. In other words, what about God is revealed through his son Jesus, and how is he revealed?

Epiphany begins this Sunday (January 8th) with our commemoration of The Baptism of the Lord and ends with Transfiguration Sunday on February 19th. The Scripture readings during these seven weeks give us a brief, but dazzling tour of just who Jesus is and who he reveals his Heavenly Father to be.

The Scripture readings for this week are from Isaiah 42:1-9 and Matthew 3:13-17. I've listed hyperlinks below to the readings for those receiving this newsletter via email, so you can locate each reading online.

## ANNUAL CHURCH CONFERENCE – MINUTES December 14, 2022 at the Ely United Methodist Church

**Call To Order:** Pastor Craig Haberman called the meeting to order at 7 PM and opened with a prayer. He briefly explained to the attending confirmands what the meeting was all about along with a reference to 1 Corinthians 12:1-16 with Paul's analogy to a body to explain all the many parts involved in making a church function successfully.

**State of the Church:** Pastor Craig referred us to the 2022 Church Conference handout containing a brief statement about the state of the church from his observations about the past couple of years.

**Budget for 2023:** The Ad Council had reviewed and approved the Finance Committee proposed 2023 Budget of \$109,724 at their November 17, 2022 meeting. Subsequent to that approval, however, we learned that our Minnesota Conference had opted to use some reserve funds to cover some of the Pension costs normally paid by the church, thus reducing our total Ministerial Support costs and making the subsequent proposed 2023 Budget less than the 2022 Budget by more than \$1600. Jeanne Tomlinson moved that we approve the 2023 Budget of \$107,851; second by Margie Olson. Motion carried.

She'll be making the annual \$600+ payment to the North Star District for our UMW membership. Checking balance is currently \$4,549.65 and savings has \$11,622.91. ### **Old Business**

• Supplies Organization: Jeanne reported that she won't be convening a Supplies Committee meeting until sometime in January and will be taking care of checking supplies and replenishing

needed items until then.

• Pasties: Jeanne reported we made 809 pasties and brought in over \$6600 for our November 15

sales. We had good crews for prep and production but could still use more people for the cleanup. We'll try to make a point of mentioning it for our next pasty-making. Marge mentioned that we should probably get new mops since the current ones never rinse out clean. She'll look into it. Our next pasties will January 16 & 17.

### **New Business**

• **Prayer Shawl Ministry Funds:** Jeanne reported that she's been handling donations and expense

reimbursements for the Prayer Shawl ministry with a cash account that had been started about 15 years previously. She recommended that UMW take on this ministry so that it is no longer cash transactions. Pam Turnbull moved that we do this; second by Donna Rusco. Motion passed. Jeanne will deposit the remaining funds into the UMW account and turn over the records to Sharon Luthens. Donna Rusco talked briefly about recent and planned distributions of the current shawls. Gail Haney has been tracking who receives them. Donna mentioned that there aren't very many knitters anymore. Paula Mattila suggested that perhaps it could evolve into a "lap quilt" ministry.

- Christmas Luncheon: We talked about when we should have our Christmas Luncheon and decided to try for Wednesday, December 7. Jeanne will check with the GEL to see if that's possible. As we did last year, we'll do an "order off the menu" arrangement and ask for round tables to be set up.
- Northwoods Partners Appreciation Reception: Our UMW chapter received an invitation to the reception being held at the GEL on November 30 from 6:30-8 PM. Anyone who is interested in attending needs to RSVP to Northwoods Partners (218-365-8019). Lucy reported that Northwoods Partners is short on decorated wreaths for the *Festival of Trees*. If anyone is willing to do one, they should call Northwoods Partners directly.
- Adding lighting to the west side of the building: Paula Mattila asked if it was possible to add night-time lighting to the west side of the church since that area is very dark now for those who park on 3rd street for evening church activities, such as choir. Margie said it's not a simple fix since they'll need to bring in an electrician to handle it. She'll bring it up with the Trustees when they meet in April.

Our next meeting will be our Christmas Luncheon, hopefully on December 7, 2022. We adjourned the business meeting at 10:45 AM. Jeanne & Lucy departed to attend a funeral.

The group continued with devotional time, reading Chapter 2 of *Rich in the Things That Count the Most*. This chapter was about being "Rich in the Soul" and the signs of a healthy spirit and church in good Connectedness, Communication and Caring.
