Second, we encourage those who are interested in staying for Coffee Fellowship to take a turn serving, by signing up on the sign-up sheet, which is posted on the bulletin board at the rear of the church.

Serving Coffee Fellowship can be as simple as making coffee. In addition, you may choose to serve cookies, bars, or donuts purchased from a store. Or bring in some baked goods from home, if you're feeling ambitious, have a little extra time, and have talents in the kitchen. It's as simple as that. The church has the coffee pot, cups, serving utensils, and the coffee.
