A Note from Pastor Craig

Spring arrived on the calendar on March 20, this past Monday. Also known as "astronomical spring," this occurs during the vernal equinox, when there is the same amount of sunlight and darkness at the equator.

"Meteorological spring," however, arrived March 1st. I'd never heard of such a thing until the past several years. Did they just make this up recently or have I had my head in the sand?

But the spring that truly matters is when it actually arrives, isn't it? It's called "Spring Up North," and it begins sometime in late April, if we're lucky - when the signs of spring show up in our area. When most of the snow is melted, except for deep in the woods, and for a flurry here and there. When the ice goes out on Burntside Lake. With the opening of fishing.

The date of Easter Sunday is one thing we do know for certain each year. Easter Sunday is the first Sunday, following the first full moon, following the spring (vernal) equinox. Every year. So this year, the first full moon following March 20 is April 5th; and the first Sunday following April 5th is April 9th, when we'll rejoice and sing "Christ the Lord is Risen Today."

I'm presently reading slowly through "The Hopetomlinson.jay@gmail.com of Glory: Reflections on the Last Words of Jesus from the Cross," a short devotional book written by the Pulitzer Prize winning novelist Jon Meacham.

In a section devoted to how the theme of forgiveness is especially prevalent in the Gospel of Luke, Meacham suggests that Luke was especially skilled at portraying Jesus' life in a manner that draws people to faith in Jesus Christ.

As an example, he tells a story of great classical scholar, who was a poet and translator of Greek texts, including the New Testament. This man attended church regularly, but he never took communion, nor was he baptized.

Despite his love for the New Testament, this learned man was skeptical of Christianity itself. Until one day when it all changed. He came forward and asked to be baptized. His pastor, who had surmised all along that he was a skeptic, asked the scholar when his doubts went away.

The scholar replied: "Somewhere in St. Luke." This is the power of Scripture to draw us to Jesus Christ. This is the life-changing, life-transforming nature of the Gospel to give us an ever-growing desire to know God and to grow in faith, hope, and love.

May it be so for each one of us, this Easter and beyond. Pastor Craig
