A Note from Pastor Craig

Easter Sunday was less than a week ago, but somehow it seems further back to me. However, my memories remain fresh - what a morning, what a day!

Our worship service was inspiring - a large turnout of people enthusiastically sang joyful hymns celebrating Christ's resurrection and the Scripture readings for Easter Sunday are always filled with vibrant and profound hope.

The mood within the walls of our church sanctuary was strikingly different from much of what we see, read, and hear in the news media, where reporting is often negative about what's happening in the "outside world."

The events reported <u>are</u> alarming: more gun violence, political rancor, and a stalemate in finding solutions to vexing problems. This week we heard of a new and deadly street drug that is circulating. A number of indexes for physical health of people in our country are heading in the wrong direction.

These events are very real (even when subtracting out slanted news coverage) - but perhaps what makes them feel so overwhelming is a "crisis of meaning." It seems the bad outweighs the good and maybe life isn't worth living. Some young people fear to bring children into a world like ours and we have coined the new term "deaths of despair," to refer to suicide and chronic and fatal alcohol and drug abuse.

Alfred Delp, a Catholic priest in Germany who died a martyr's death at the hand of the Nazi's in 1944, believed that "humans have become incapable of God." What he meant is our ways of thinking, behaving, and orienting our lives have blunted our ability to picture God as part of the world and experience God as a living reality in our lives.

The New Testament records a second miracle in the aftermath of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, namely the gift of the Holy Spirit to the gathered followers of Jesus and the birth of the church.

Having experienced new life in Christ, these men and women spread the Good News "from Jerusalem and Judea to the ends of the earth." This is the joy, which echoed through our church sanctuary last Sunday.

We walk alongside these early followers during the season of Easter, a season that extends the joy of the resurrection. In doing so, we experience meaning in our lives by bringing this light to other people. May you be filled with this Easter joy and experience rich meaning for life.

We lift up the following in prayer...


- Bob Lindholm's family and friends Bob passed away on Wednesday. Please be in prayer for Laverne and her family and friends.
