A Note from Pastor Craig

Watching weather forecasts recently, I've felt compassion for people affected by the extreme heat, especially those in the desert southwest. I've also been a bit astonished by our unseasonably cool weather. On some days our high temperature is 55 degrees less than that of Phoenix. It's hard to comprehend this.

While the cool and damp weather has lessened the threat of wildfire in our region, it's also dampened vacation hopes of some people I'm sure, as well as slowed the number of people passing through area businesses.

Last week I wrote the following paragraph in my weekly note: "But what does it mean to be created in "the image of God?" Robinson suggests the following: 'The fact we have a soul 'uniquely invests each individual person with an absolute dignity and significance. This understanding places great value in the individual and, at the same time, finds great significance in the moment-to-moment conduct of mortal life.' (What are We Doing Here, p. 212)"

This week I'm going to mention some additional words that Marilynne Robinson writes, which logically follow what she writes above and are equally important for us to remember every day.

Because you and I are persons of absolute dignity (being that we are created in the image of God), this means that every other person is as well. From the

greatest to the least of all. Robinson writes: "The concept of the soul is the profoundest possible bond among us, an unshakable basis for compassion, recognition, and love, which, acknowledged, would enable us to love enemies, welcome strangers and all the rest." (What Are We Doing Here? Essays p. 205)

God's steadfast love for us irresistibly draws us to love others. It also serves as a caution against mistreating others, for as Jesus tells his followers - when we do not welcome the stranger, do not clothe the naked, do not visit the sick, and do not visit those in prison, "when you haven't done it to the least of these you did not do it unto me."

So what does it all mean? All God's sons and daughters are God's beloved. You and I can live joyfully, filled with the deepest peace, knowing God loves us. We can marvel at each of the other images of God who are placed in our midst, loving them with the same love with which God loves us.
