### A Note from Pastor Craig

Last week here I mentioned I was going to pass along a few thoughts on how technology not only enhances our life, but also alters the way we perceive and experience life. (These thoughts come from a recent issue of *Modern Reformation Magazine*.)

For instance, I'm writing these words on my Apple notebook computer and sending them out to most of you electronically. This is vastly more efficient than forty years ago when I typed them up on a mimeograph stencil, ran them off on a mimeograph machine, assembled them for mailing, and mailed them.

At the same time <u>my experience</u> is also different. While typing, I'm tempted to jump off and browse through Facebook or several magazines and newspapers I receive online. I'm spending less time on the newsletter itself, but I'm also living more in the virtual world, rather than the material world. Your experience of reading the newsletter is different as well. Most of you quickly surf through the newsletter online rather than going to the mailbox, retrieving it, carrying it inside, and then slowly reading it with a cup of coffee.

Christian faith is based firmly in the material world. We're told "In the beginning" God created all things, looked upon them as they related to each other according to God's purposes, and "saw that it was very good." Jesus Christ, was and is fully God, yet also became fully human, one of us.

Technology allows us to be in constant contact, should we choose, with the news and one another around the world, instantaneously and twenty-four hours a day, which is far different from a century or two ago. But how well are we anchored right where we

live - the place and the people? We may have 1000 Facebook friends, but how many close or best friends that we spend time with face to face?

In matters of faith, we are able to stream worship services from multiple churches and listen to a whole host of podcasts. <u>This is</u> a blessing for the isolated and homebound. For the fully mobile, it broadens our experiences, introducing us to a wonderful variety of inspirational people and ideas. You know what I mean! An unintended consequence, however, is it also may disengage us from the churches and small groups we are a part of and pull us into a privatized world of faith.

The churches the Apostle Paul wrote letters to (occasionally when he was in prison) brought inspiration, hope, encouragement, and wisdom to those he was separated from by distance and circumstance. Yet over and over in these letters he mentions how he "longs to see you that I may be filled with joy." Nothing can replace face to face contact.

How can we make this a win/win situation - "using" technology to expand and revitalize our faith, even while immersing ourselves face to face in the here and now, anchoring our faith more fully in Jesus Christ, and reviving our fellowship with one another? God's amazing grace and deep peace are with you as September begins. Pastor Craig
