Our All Saints' Observance at Ely United Methodist

All Saints' Sunday has become one of my favorite in the Christian year, trailing only Easter, Christmas Eve, Pentecost, and Ash Wednesday. It's a profound day, deserving our joyful participation.

There is some background to exactly what All Saints' Day is in the note just to the right of this sidebar.

So how will we observe All Saints' Sunday at Ely UMC?

You'll find a small sheet of paper included with your bulletin. You are invited to list the name of any loved one(s) who have died in the last year and their relationship to you. We will read their names during the communion liturgy.

We will mention Ely UMC church members who have died in the last year as well as 60, 50, and 40 year members.

We will dedicate memorial gifts to the church in the last year.

There will be coffee and cake following the service.

A Note from Pastor Craig

The arrival of our first measurable snowfall in Ely and a plunge in temperatures coincided with Halloween this year, which also means November (think deer season and Thanksgiving) comes next.

What then, is this All Saints' Sunday that we are observing in worship on November 5th? Some of you may be thinking "I don't remember ever talking about this when I was growing up." Me neither; these newer services became part of our United Methodist Church calendar about the time I graduated from seminary in the mid 1980's.

They were part of a larger movement within United Methodism to incorporate some of the rich liturgical heritage of the Roman Catholic and Lutheran traditions into our evangelical DNA. I've always deeply valued both of these strands of our denomination - we are evangelical (emphasizing being "born anew/born again") and also part of a worship tradition that extends back through the centuries right into the Upper Room where Jesus gathered with his disciples for the Last Supper.

The Roman Catholic Church celebrates All Saints' Day on November 1st and All Souls' Day on November 2nd. What's the difference? All Saints' remembers and give thanks for those who lived and died in faith and are now in glory. All Souls' Day is linked with the Roman Catholic doctrine of purgatory and is a time when we pray for the faithful departed who await future glory, following their intervening time in purgatory.

N.T. Wright an evangelical Anglican churchman and New Testament scholar suggests it is more scriptural to combine the two and I agree. Why? The obvious reason is purgatory isn't part of our belief system. Equally important, to do so assumes the heroes of our faith were so different from us when they were alive; which just isn't the case. Wright puts it this way: "What makes the 'great ones' great is precisely that they, too, knew human grief and frailty." (For All the Saints: Remembering the Christian Departed. p.49)

What makes "the saints" so remarkable isn't the gifts/abilities they were given at birth or the supreme efforts they made throughout their lives. No, rather, they became who they were as a result of <u>what they allowed God to do in and through them.</u>" Their joy came as they trusted God completely and followed where God led.
