The Joy and Possibility of Advent

In our day we are being given the opportunity to see the unfolding drama of the cosmos with our own eyes. Telescopes reveal the existence and formation of stars, planets, solar systems, and even entire galaxies. Electron microscopes and other technology allow us to witness the wonder of genes, molecular structures, cellular processes, and other phenomena. John F. Haught, a theologian at Georgetown University, calls this the "outside story of the universe."

But he goes on to say there is an "inside story of the universe" as well that has to do with the rise of human consciousness. This is the "heat of inner experience" of human beings - our feverish interior dimension of living, thinking, learning, and worshiping.

This is the inner drama that burns within each human heart as the Spirit awakens us to God present in the risen Christ within each of us. We are then propelled to interact with one another in our families, churches, communities, and among all the peoples of the human family spread throughout the world.

Put the outer and inner stories of the university together Haught says and we have a full understanding of the "big and epic" story of our unfolding and awakening universe.

You and I are part of this drama, this story, each and every day of our lives. This often goes unnoticed, however, because of the long list of responsibilities that make up our days - our unrelenting schedule of work, home, families, community events, and things as mundane as the leaky faucet and emails to read, answer, or unsubscribe from!

But the central drama of the universe remains there nonetheless for us to absorb as the "outer story" is narrated in the discoveries of science we see in documentaries, online articles, and science magazines. And the "inner story" is available for our study and spiritual growth in the Bible and in 3000+ years of inspired devotional and theological writing. We have no lack of food for the head and heart.

This is the joy and possibility we proclaim and celebrate during Advent, because the Church Year begins by telling the inner story of the universe with the Coming of God as it reaches its fullest expression for followers of Jesus in a manger in Bethlehem. This Coming of God began far earlier in time, however, in the first moments of Creation, continued in the covenants we see in the Old Testament, and with the coming of Christ is now extended in a tangible manner to all the peoples of the earth (Jew and Gentile alike).
