A Note from Pastor Craig

We are witnessing conflicting images and emotion-laden words pass through the airwaves, printed in newspapers, and flooding screens of our devices as the Presidential Primary season moves to Iowa, New Hampshire, and then on to seven states who will hold their primaries on Super Tuesday, March 9th.

There are two vastly different pictures being drawn of where our country is right now and the direction we ought to choose for the future. Proponents of both views are sounding ominous warnings that democracy "hangs in the balance" with this election.

Unfortunately these differing views of reality have strong emotions attached to them that filter down into communities, local governments, school boards, and even into families. These sorts of disagreements have been around since our country was founded, but they are dividing people today more starkly than ever before.

There are many factors, which not everyone agrees upon, but there is no disagreement about what it's doing to us as a nation. For the first time in memory people view those who disagree with them as simply bad people, as less than human and not deserving of respect. Finally it seems as though people on both sides of these divisive issues are hunkering down in emotional enclaves with like-thinking people and choosing to avoid those others who "just don't get it."

What are we supposed to do; as citizens and even more so, as Christians? There <u>are</u> different ways to become involved in the political process at the state and national level. Certainly getting out to vote is a huge privilege and responsibility for all of us. Beyond that, quite frankly, our impact is somewhat limited. But there are several ways that make a huge difference locally in building healthy families, local schools, churches, and communities. I'll mention two.

- <u>The Rule of Christ.</u> Our church has earnestly been publicizing this event we are hosting Sunday, January 28 following worship. I won't add any additional information here except to say (again) this gives a better way to communicate with anyone we meet, which improves our life.
- 2. <u>Braver Angels.</u> I've mentioned this in passing once before and an article in the December 30, 2023 edition of the Ely Echo. This is a national program, which brings together people of differing viewpoints to have constructive conversations with each other. www.braverangels.org.
