A Note from Pastor Craig

The people in our church love to sing hymns. We sing fervently and with conviction, which along with quiet prayerfulness, is a central part of worship. The Psalms exhort us again and again to "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord."

Hymn-singing is not only an important expression of our faith, it is also deeply personal. Singing some hymns transport us back to our earliest childhood memories. Other hymns surprise us by bringing forth tears because they were sung at a loved ones' funeral. And then there are those we all love, like "Here I Am, Lord" that we sang last week; for these hymns bring a surge of emotion, calling us to renewed and deeper faith.

Looking in the bulletin to see what hymns we were singing was one of the first things I did when entering the sanctuary the year before my family and I ventured off to seminary. I was hoping to see familiar selections I enjoyed singing and which inspired me. I suspect it's much the same with you.

This makes choosing hymns for worship services one of the more challenging tasks for any pastor. My comment last week during worship about conflict in congregations over music was completely unplanned - it surprised even me! I made the comment spontaneously because this balancing act is never far from my mind when planning worship services.

The needle I am trying to thread is to select hymns that both follow the Scripture readings, church season, and theme for the day <u>and</u> appeal to people of all ages and interests in worship styles. This is difficult because to examine closely the saying "I like the old hymns best," is to recognize the "old hymns" are the ones we grew up with. And we all grew up at different times and in families/churches where certain hymns were the most loved.

Please know I truly value your feedback and suggestions in general and regarding our worship services. My goal each Sunday is to include at least one hymn that will be appreciated by each of you, whatever your age or preferred music style. Full disclosure: My preference is for a variety of hymns, but with priority to older hymns with firm footing in historical/liturgical tradition. I also enjoy contemporary music of all kinds that is done well.

Music in our worship services is something for us followers of Christ, who both love God and each other, to work on together as we seek to "Lift every voice and sing, til' earth and heaven ring." Pastor Craig
