A Note from Pastor Craig

I was heartened, but not surprised, upon moving to Ely to discover what a strong, vital, and lively church we are. Often family-type churches are this way and I knew Dana Thompson to be an energetic pastor dedicated to Christ. It also came as no surprise to find a group of committed leaders, who possess such a wide variety of gifts and the desire to use them on behalf of Christ, our church, and the Ely area.

Within a year and a half of my arrival we were plunged into a pandemic that disrupted life in every corner of our planet - families, schools, businesses, governments, and health systems were turned upside down. Churches were no exception.

Every generation seems to experience at least one major tribulation, sometimes more. Covid-19 was ours. Once again, we found God's provision carried His human family through the sound and fury of it all.

Ely UMC was no exception. Our church leadership responded each step of the way to what was being required. You supported us in remarkable ways - financially and with your participation. We are every bit as strong, maybe stronger, than in March of 2020. For this I'm grateful, even as I grieve for churches in our Annual Conference and beyond who either are severely diminished or have closed as a result of Covid-19.

Now the pandemic is mostly in the rearview mirror. Our church feels the same to me as before in many ways - our activities, level of participation,

and vitality. But we have also entered a new season whether we realize it or not. This would be the case even if I weren't retiring; I suppose my retirement makes it more recognizable.

Our Ad Council sees this as an opportunity and not something to be to be avoided or ignored. We are embracing the moment by enthusiastically "getting busy" for the right reasons and in the right ways. The remodeling project is just one example. We are relying on the Holy Spirit to lead us into this new day.

At our meeting this week someone showed our Ad Council a series of pictures of our church building years ago. We were astonished at how much the exterior changed even during that span! But it is still clearly recognizable as our church. The same is true with our church family. People may ask that prayers be renewed on the list for subsequent 4-week periods. The Prayer Wall is finalized each Thursday for the Sunday morning service.
