A Note from Pastor Craig

Two weeks ago, I mentioned in this space how a deep immersion in nature brings us closer to God as we stand amazed before the beauty of God's Creation. I also mentioned the necessity in our lives for the Church, which is the living Body of Christ in the world. Finally, I wondered if perhaps God's Creation (nature) and the Church complement each other in the lives of disciples of Jesus Christ.

I think they most certainly do. What follows here is a brief summary of the consensus that has emerged within Christian tradition after many centuries of prayerful reflection.

First, God can only be known if, when, and how God chooses to be revealed to us. We cannot climb a ladder to God, so to speak, to know God or the ways of God.

Second, God's gracious revelation comes to us in two ways - <u>General Revelation</u> and <u>Special Revelation</u>. I'll mention more about each in the paragraphs below, but before that I want to mention one exception to General and Special Revelation, rare but significant, nevertheless.

<u>Unitive Experience</u> refers to those moments when a person finds themself in a brief altered state of consciousness that is not a result of any event in the natural world - internal or external. While each experience is unique, there are common threads - an awareness of being filled with peace and love, time and place drop away, and one feels united with all humankind. These moments of Unitive Experience come unexpectedly, generally in unguarded moments, and can never be engineered by ourselves.

Back to General Revelation and Special Revelation. General Revelation is the way that God is made known to all people everywhere through nature and nature's laws, through human reasoning, and through our inner conscience. In other words General Revelation is knowledge of God through natural means. This knowledge of God is broader than Special Revelation; it has a universal aspect in that it is found everywhere.

Special Revelation, on the other hand, is the way God has chosen to be made known through supernatural means. "Supernatural" quite simply means "beyond natural means." Special Revelation includes God's revelation through Scripture, the person and ministry of Jesus Christ, the inward witness of the Spirit, and in the presence of Baptism and Holy Communion in the church.

Special Revelation is more detailed than General Revelation; it's as if we are seeing God "from the inside" rather than at an arm's length. In nature we see the grandeur of God. In Scripture, in Jesus Christ, we see right into God's heart and mind, and come face to face with God in a personal way. We see God's purpose for each of us and for God's Creation. We tangibly experience ourselves in the living and breathing Body of Christ, along with the cloud of witnesses of all who have gone before. May you experience both the grandeur of God in nature and the personal presence of God in your life. Pastor Craig
