### **Small Group Sessions**

The Visioning Committee has been studying the responses to the questions from the *Natural Church Development Survey* and while all our results were within the average range for all churches participating in the survey, one of the categories that received a lower value for our church was *Holistic Small Groups*.

The importance of Holistic Small Groups (meaning the relationship of small groups to the whole) to churches ranging in size from 200 to 250 active members is paramount to their health and continued growth. The size of our church congregation allows for us to know everyone in attendance, even if we need a name tag reminder from time to time. It doesn't mean our church does not have small groups. We have our fellowship after the church service, the 10:00 AM morning coffee group at the DQ, our Pastie crew, the UMW, and

the Sunday lunch group at the Steak House, just to name a few.

That said, the Visioning committee felt that a special series of small group sessions expanding on the topics presented at the 2019 Minnesota UMC Annual Conference might lead to regularly scheduled small group meetings for fellowship and learning. Jay Tomlinson and Lucy Diesslin volunteered to be group facilitators.

The first small group session was held on Sunday, November 10th at 1:00 PM with the same topics covered on Monday at 3:30 PM, and on Tuesday evening at 6:00 PM. The topics dealt with the up-and-coming 2020 UMC General Conference, the 2020 Minnesota UMC Annual Conference and *The Way Forward*. Short video presentations helped initiate discussions about the topics and the session lasted between 35 and 45 minutes.

The hope is that as more sessions are scheduled in the future, the attendance would grow for each session and stabilize. The next sessions will be scheduled in January and announced at Sunday worship services in December and in the January newsletter, *The Fish*. Future topics include "Evangelism for Non-Evangelists" (2 sessions); "UMC Seeks to Eliminate Racism"; "Assimilating New Members/Community Outreach and Witness".

Sessions for each topic will continue to be offered on the Sunday at 1:00 PM, the following Monday at 3:30 PM, and then on Tuesday at 6:00 PM. Sessions are designed to be 35-45 minutes with short video presentations to stimulate discussion and learning. It is hoped that by offering the same session topic at 3 different times, all who wish to participate will be able to attend at least one of the sessions.

Opening: Pastor Craig provided the "Opening Thought" from chapter 3 of Habakkuk emphasizing rejoicing in all circumstances. He then opened the meeting with prayer.

**Minutes:** The October 16, 2019 Ad Council minutes were approved as printed in the November *FISH*. Motion to approve by Beverly Johnson; second by Margie Olson. Motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report:** Mark Olson presented the October 2019 Treasurer's Report. Receipts & disbursements were \$8,653.09 & \$8,269.96, respectively. Ending balances were: Undesignated Funds \$13,728.72; Building Fund \$3,768.64; Memorial Fund \$10,209.62; Parish Health Ministries \$400; R3 Project \$170.25; Gift of Giving Project \$1,135.16. Motion to accept by Jeanne Tomlinson, second by Margie Olson. Motion approved.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

- Trustees: Margie Olson reported that there was a temporary heat issue in the sanctuary during pasties but it seems to have resolved itself. Mark suggested the cold air coming in through the walls may impact the thermostat temperature sensor. Margie pointed out what looks like possible vandalism to the screen covering a hole under the office stairs as well as handicapped sign on the building. Pastor Craig brought up an issue with the parsonage home line suggesting we may want to consider dropping it. For now, he'll contact Frontier to look into the problem and will also have the number forwarded to his cell phone.
- Memorial Fund: Via a report sent to Jay prior to the meeting, Carol Linneman reported tat \$111.29 was spentfor books & crayons for the kid's activity bags in memory of Eric Schultz; \$59.05 was spent for a cabinet in the upstairs restroom in memory of Molly Hill; \$185.25 was spent for choir music in memory of John Bakesley. The next meeting,

- originally scheduled for February, was postponed to April 28 since Carol will be in Arizona for the winter. At that meeting they will finalize plans for Memorial Sunday which will be on May 10, 2020.
- Finance: Bev Johnson reported that the committee met on November 13 to develop the 2020 Budget and submitted the results to the Ad Council for approval. Motion to approve by Mark Olson, second by Margie Olson. Motion passed. This budget will be presented at the Church Conference on December 18 for church approval.
- Outreach: Jay Tomlinson reported updates on the Gift of Giving project for this year. Tricia Schreffler is working with Jay as they meet with the Carefree Living and Boundary Waters Care Center staff to develop the gift lists. Tricia has volunteered to take over the project next year. The kids will be working on making about 90 cards to go with the gifts. Gift bags have already been purchased. The gifts will be distributed on Dec 17 at 3 PM at BWCC and on Dec 24 at 1 PM at Carefree Living. Bagging date(s) will be scheduled for prior to those dates and will be announced at church.
- Worship: Bev Johnson reported that the Hanging of the Greens was tweaked a little from what was originally announced and mentioned in the November FISH. The decorating will begin at 2 PM with a meal to follow prepared by the Rue family. There were sign up sheets handed out at the November 17 worship service for people to indicate their interest in the different tasks. Dan Johnson will help guide people to the various

- tasks to ensure that experienced people will guide any new helpers through each of the tasks. The committee is working on lining up readers for the Christmas Eve program which will once again be at 5:30 PM; Patty Rusco is handling getting readers for the Advent Wreath for each Sunday in Advent.
