The September end of the month account balances - General Fund: \$2,320.81; Building Fund: \$20,731.60; Reserve Fund \$5013.17, Memorial Fund: \$11,605.67

The **Board of Trustees** Chairperson Margie Olson reported on the status of the stairway remodel being completed by Rich Floyd and Norman Rusco. The summer Lawn Maintenance by volunteers went well, with thanks to all who volunteered. The winter Snow Shoveling volunteer sign-up sheet and shoveling guidelines are posted on the bulletin board. New carpeting has been purchased for the Church front entry and stairs, to be installed soon. Stripping and re-waxing of the Fellowship Hall; Floor is being scheduled. The Board of Trustees would like to thank Mark Luthens, Justin Zemke, Dan & Bev Johnson, Pastor Dana Thompson and Mark Olson for doing the lawn care and mowing this summer.

We are now looking for volunteers for sidewalk snow shoveling for the winter months. We need to keep the Church sidewalks and entryways clear of snow and Ice during the winter months. Mark & Margie Olson have signed up for November, so December thru April need to be filled. Volunteers can sign up for a month at a time by themselves or get together with other people and do a month that way.

The walkways and sidewalks to the church entrances – the front door, the handicapped ramp and the rear door to the Fellowship Hall (basement) – must be kept safe for walking and be welcoming to those coming to the Church during the winter months.

The maintenance of the sidewalks entails the removal of snow and ice in a timely manner after a snowfall, to ensure the sidewalks are as safe as possible. **On Sunday mornings the walkways need to be shoveled before 8:30am**. The Church provides snow shovels, ice scrapers and brooms for removing snow and ice. These tools are stored in the Church garage during the summer months and are placed next to the front doors and the back door to the Fellowship hall during the winter months.

The Church has ice-melting calcium chloride and sand for better traction on ice. These are kept in the coat closet in the overflow room. Please notify one the the Trustees or the Pastor, if the Church needs to purchase additional ice-melt, sand or snow removal tools.

The Church is responsible for maintaining and clearing all of the "public" sidewalks adjacent to the Church property – along Camp

Street, and along Third Avenue next to the Church and the lower Parking Lot. Ely city ordinances require property owners to keep the public sidewalk adjacent to their property cleared of snow and ice. (As a rule, the volunteers who plow the parking lot usually use their plows to do the "public" sidewalks, however some clean-up may be needed by the basement entrance)
