- We discussed a possible Ghana Challenging Heights mission project. Lucy had talked to Caroline Owens who's thinking about going again perhaps next year. It would be nice to do something to help out with her next trip.
- For the Reach-Renew-Rejoice campaign, Jeanne reported that we have \$1542 towards our \$2020 goal for 2015. The Ad Council will be discussing setting a goal for 2016 and Dana suggested our group be thinking about possibly helping with another donation like we did this year.
- Our first participation in the multi-church Side Street BBQ-Potluck with the First Presbyterian Church and Grace Lutheran church on August 9 went fairly well. The Minutes of the September 16, 2015 Ad Council meeting were approved as printed.

The **Treasurer's Report** for September, 2015 was presented by Treasurer Mark Olson and accepted. The September end of the month account balances - General Fund: \$3,675.32; Building Fund: \$21,294.07; Memorial Fund: \$11,478.91; Parish Health Ministries 516.66; Undesignated Funds \$3,000. M/Lucy/S/Bonnie

The **Board of Trustees** Margie reported that the Trustees met October 5, 2015.

- The Calendar for Winter Sidewalk Snow Shoveling is posted on the Bulletin Board volunteers urged to sign up
- The two dehumidifiers at the parsonage need to be replaced for next summer
- The Church's propane cost is \$1.09/gal. for 2015-16
- BJ Rusco will clean, check and make necessary repairs to the Church furnaces

The **Pastor Parish Relations Committee** will meet November 11, 2015. They will begin working on the salary related material for the 2016 Church Budget prior to 2016 Church Conference.

The **Finance Committee** will meet in mid-November to develop the 2016 Church Budget.

Parish Health Ministries – Reminded everyone that we are in the "Cold and Flu Season" and recommended that non-touching greetings be exchanged at church. *File of Life magnetic refrigerator pockets* – for emergency medical information are available for anyone.

- A) All of the old tables in the garage be disposed of as a safety liability, B) Six new 8' long resin topped tables be purchased (∼\$80 each) with memorial funds, C) Six of the 'most worn' current basement tables be stored in the garage for church member and offsite church function use. M/Lucy/S/Toni/Approved.
- 2. Communion Table Glass Replacement The glass top on the Church's Communion Table has chipped corners and is a safety hazard. Those present approved a motion to replace the existing glass and recommend purchase by Memorial funds. M/Lucy/S/Toni/ Approved
- 3. Church Bazaar Saturday, November 7, 2015 The Women of the Church reported on the planning progress for the upcoming Bazaar.
- 4. "Stanley the Scarecrow" "Stanley" will be in the back of the Church Through October 26 collecting canned goods and monetary donations for the Ely Food Shelf. Please make Checks payable to the Church and the Church will send one check to the Food Shelf.
- 5. **Giving Tree Outreach** The Giving tree will be in the back of the Church November 15-December 6. The gifts will be picked up December 7.
- 6. Church Large Refrigerator Maintenance The large refrigerator at the Church needed for adequate storage of meat and dough balls during pasty making; required a maintenance call to replace a temperature controlled switch. The maintenance man recommended not operating the refrigerator with a small amount of things in the refrigerator. The near-empty refrigerator will turn on and off more often wearing out the switch more frequently. Either we empty and turn off the refrigerator or place jugs of

- water in the refrigerator to hold cold temperatures longer.
- 7. **North Star District Fund** Our Church's share of this fund for 2016 will be \$175.75 up from \$109. /M/ Lucy/S/Bonnie/ Motion Approved.
