Do you attend church? If so, God has placed a person in your life whose job it is to train you in righteousness and speak the truth, even when you don't want to hear it. You are blessed to have a pastor who loves you and cares about your spiritual well-being. He needs to know you care about him too.

Many churchgoers neglect to encourage the pastor, but being aware of his needs is an important part of belonging to the body of Christ. In his second letter to Timothy, Paul models the way we're to encourage those who minister.

- 2. **Tell your pastor you appreciate him**. There's nothing more uplifting to a person's heart than to know someone else cares. Words are certainly valuable, but actions can speak even more loudly. So intentionally seek ways to demonstrate your love for your minister.
- 3. **Express confidence in the pastor**. Let him know you recognize the sincerity of his faith and appreciate his commitment to speak scriptural truths into your life.
- 4. Affirm the call of God on his life. Work with your pastor; respond to him in a way that shows you understand he's been called to minister and therefore has God's hand upon him. And when you experience the Lord working through him, let him know.

Above all, pray for your pastor. Don't assume that others in the church are praying or that a spiritual leader doesn't need intercession. The opposite is true. The devil would like to thwart effective ministering, but you can help to defend your shepherd as he tends the flock.

Landscape Committee Update

Permission to landscape our church front yard has been approved by the Administrative Council. A rock garden theme will include three slow-growing evergreens, one 5 to 6 feet tree and two 24-inch dwarf pine cultivars, various perennials and space for planting annuals. Rocks and border edging will delineate the garden areas. The remainder of the yard will be a seeded lawn of salt tolerant boulevard grasses.

Estimated cost of the three space appropriate evergreens is \$700, since they will be about 8-10 years old at time of purchase. Garden soil, edging, seed, perennials and annuals, along with miscellaneous materials constitute the remainder of the expenditures, about \$1,000. Several of the congregation have volunteered equipment and labor which will be needed for stripping the current lawn, spreading garden soil, placing rocks and seeding. As for rock, **all can help by donating a stone or two**. We will need about fifty small, 7 to 9 inch stones, about a dozen 12 to 15 inch rocks, and seven small "boulders," 18-24 inches.

We will be starting work on this in early September, hopefully as soon as the day after Labor Day. Helping hands are always needed and appreciated. We'll do what we can this fall and then finish up next spring.

The estimated cost of \$1,700 is being funded through designated landscape gifts and from our current memorial fund, if needed. If you care to donate to the cost of plants and materials, make your check out to the Ely United Methodist Church and write *Landscape* on the memo line of your check.

We sure hope to see you and your child or children there. It is a wonderful opportunity to start, or further, children on their spiritual journeys.

The United Methodist Church Commission on the Way Forward 5 Things You Need To Know

During the past decade or so same sex marriage has been a social issue with legal implications. This national debate has reached into every family, community, and church as well. Christians with both traditional views on human sexuality and liberal views have expressed their concerns within congregations. All Christian denominations are responding in one way or another regarding same-sex marriage within local churches and the ordination of gay and lesbian persons. Coming out of the 2016 General Conference, the United Methodist Church appointed a thirty-two person **"Commission on the Way Forward"** to make a thorough and prayerful study of the issue and bring a report to the Council of Bishops. This report will come before a specially-called General Conference to be held in St. Louis on February 23 – 26, 2019.

The Commission's recommendation is for a "**one church**" model, which seeks to make room within the United Methodist Church for people of both viewpoints.
