A Note from Pastor Craig

February was an extremely busy month for our Ely United Methodist Church prayer chain as well as for each of us praying for people we love and are concerned about. I can't recall any time since I moved to Ely in July of 2018 when as many people in our congregation were experiencing surgeries, major medical tests, accidents, illnesses, and deaths in their family.

Monday, February 10, was an especially busy day with half a dozen or so people from our congregation doctoring for significant conditions.

We are always reliant upon God for our existence from moment to moment. A memorable line from Scripture, which means a lot to me, refers to God as the one "in whom we live, and move, and have our being." (Acts 17:28) Most of the time, however, the awareness of how quickly life can change is beneath our level of consciousness. Generally speaking, without being presumptuous, we are accustomed to God's goodness being more or less continuous in our life.

Then, comes a moment, when in a heartbeat the fragility of life comes crashing down upon us. Yes, life is good; our bodies are complex and resilient, we are surrounded by doctors, hospitals, car mechanics, power utilities, those in the working trades, and wonderful people who provide us with a high quality of life. Yet, the unthinkable still happens and we are brought face to face with the reality that we are not in charge of our lives; we are not in control.

We are now in the church season of Lent, where the focus is on the journey Jesus makes from Galilee to Jerusalem, from being a teacher, preacher, and healer, to one who lays down his life for each of us and for the world. We see in Jesus' life and death that God's power and grace is focused upon the cross; upon Jesus' death and resurrection. God's strength is not brute force, rather that of self-giving love.

As the apostle Paul reminds us what seems at first to be sheer foolishness is indeed God's wisdom. This is not merely an "idea," it's something that makes a difference in our living and in our dying. Nicholas Wolterstorff and his wife lost a college-age son in a mountain-climbing accident. Nicholas found as he grieved his view of God changed. He writes:

Rather than Eric's death evoking in me an interest in theodicy*, it had the effect of making God more mysterious. I live with the mystery.

If I cannot make sense of it, why not give up on God? I cannot. When I consider the stupendous immensity and astonishing intricacy of the cosmos, and the miracle of human consciousness and intelligence, I find that I cannot believe it all just happened. A being of incomprehensible wisdom, imagination, and power must have brought it about – or rather, is bringing it about.

..... The God who became more mysterious to me has also become more awesome, awesome beyond comprehension. And that has magnified my astonishment that God would care about human beings.

*- theodicy is a theological category that tries to make sense of God's power and love in the face of evil. In other words, if God is all-powerful and all-loving why is there evil and suffering in the world?

Administrative Council - Minutes Wednesday, February 19, 2020 • 7:00 PM

Call To Order: Chair Dan Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Attendees (6): Craig Haberman, Bev and Dan Johnson, Margie and Mark Olson, Rich Floyd.

Opening: Craig provided opening thoughts – read a poem from *Wing over Wing* by Julie Cadwauader Staub and gave a prayer lifting up many who are ill and suffering loss.

Minutes: The minutes from the January meeting were approved as printed in the January *FISH*. Motion to approve by Margie Olson; Seconded by Rich Floyd. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report showed a beginning balance of \$21,438.83 with income of \$7,802.50 including \$153.50 from UMW for the Reach, Renew, Rejoice. In addition to the usual salary expenses, the Church Multi-coverage insurance for the year was paid (as approved by the board in January) with total disbursements of \$10,935.29. The month-end balance was 18,307.04. Motion to approve made by Bev Johnson, seconded by Margie Olson. Motion carried. (A copy of the report is attached to the written minutes).

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- Board of Trustees: No report.
- Finance Committee: No report.
- **Pastor-Parish Relations Committee:** Sheri Rue will be acting chair of PPR. They will keep the congregation abreast of pastoral abscences.
- Worship Committee: The Worship Committee has put into place the Services occurring during Lent: Ash Wednesday imposition of ashes; Maundy Thursday/ Good Friday Tenebrae service on April 9. Palms will be ordered for Palm Sunday Service. The choir will sing on Maundy Thursday, Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. The EUMC will be responsible for the Thursday Lenten supper on March 19 (we will make the mini-pasties). Pastor Craig will be away June 21 (Dana), August 2 (Marshall), August 9 (We believe that will be the Semers Park Ecumenical Service), September 13 (Dana) and September 20 (open). The next meeting is scheduled for Friday, March 27.
- Outreach: No report.
- Visioning Committee: 1) Kid's Club is currently not meeting due to few kids attending and illness.

 Depending on circumstances, it may be reconstituted on Wednesdays in the fall. 2) Racial Reconciling Covenent: currently, not much is known about this initiative, which came out of the Minnesota Annual Conference. If it simply involves signing a declaration, the committee was not too interested. There are probably some commitments involved, and that will be further investigated. 3) Pot Luck Scheduled for May 17. 4)

 Looking to the questions asked in the Natural Church Development Survey to find initiatives to undertake that would increase our spiritual enthusiasm. Sharing "God Moments" is one way, and the committee is brainstorm ing ways to do that.

OLD BUSINESS

- **Web Site:** The Web site needs to be updated to be congruent with current programs and information and in terms of its architecture, content and photos. Dan will talk with Jay about content and photos and will notify appropriate people about updating information. This will be an ongoing project.
- Uniform Pasties: After noting pasties coming out of the oven with some dark and some light, Dan Johnson worked with Mark Olson (and others) to strive for more uniformity. During this pasty run, the temperature was lowered for baking to 375 degrees and all shelves were rotated in a consistent manner creating a more uniform and lighter brown pasty.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Gideons to visit: presentation will be positive in nature and they will take an offering. They will be scheduled for sometime this summer to make a presentation during a Sunday service.
- **2. Annual Audit:** The books of the UMW, the Church, and the Building Fund were audited by the Audit Committee to prepare the report that goes to the Annual Conference. The record keeping is exemplary. The report is available in the church office.
- **3. Facebook Presence:** It was reported that there is a *Facebook* page for Ely United Methodist Church. It is not known who set it up, and how information is controlled about what appears on the site. We need to find out if anyone knows about how it was established.
- 4. Ecumenical Service (in August): Margie Olson moved that EUMC join in the service at Semers Park pending verification of time and date. This means our worship service will be cancelled on that date. Rich Floyd seconded the motion. Motion passed. Pastor Craig will bring it up at the Pastors' meeting.

Items of Information:

1. February 2020 Pasty Report: We made 584; deposits were \$3,519.00; cost \$1,201.56; net income \$2,317.44.

The meeting adjourned at 8:15 PM with a unison reciting of *The Lord's Prayer*.
